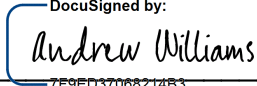

**RESOLUTION TO ADOPT BUDGET AND APPROPRIATE SUMS OF MONEY
RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF BOWLES METROPOLITAN
DISTRICT, DENVER AND JEFFERSON COUNTIES, COLORADO, PURSUANT TO
SECTION 29-1-108, C.R.S., SUMMARIZING EXPENDITURES AND REVENUES FOR
EACH FUND, ADOPTING A BUDGET AND APPROPRIATING SUMS OF MONEY
FOR THE BUDGET YEAR 2021**

- A. The Board of Directors of Bowles Metropolitan District (the “**District**”) has appointed Simmons & Wheeler, PC to prepare and submit a proposed budget to said governing body at the proper time.
- B. Simmons & Wheeler, PC has submitted a proposed budget to this governing body by October 15, 2020 for its consideration.
- C. Upon due and proper notice, published or posted in accordance with the law, said proposed budget was open for inspection by the public at a designated place, a continued public hearing was held on December 8, 2020, and interested taxpayers were given the opportunity to file or register any objections to said proposed budget.
- D. The budget has been prepared to comply with all terms, limitations and exemptions, including, but not limited to, reserve transfers and expenditure exemptions, under Article X, Section 20 of the Colorado Constitution (“**TABOR**”) and other laws or obligations which are applicable to or binding upon the District.
- E. Whatever increases may have been made in the expenditures, like increases were added to the revenues so that the budget remains in balance, as required by law.
- F. The Board of Directors has made provision therein for revenues in an amount equal to or greater than the total proposed expenditures as set forth in said budget.
- G. It is not only required by law, but also necessary to appropriate the revenues provided in the budget to and for the purposes described below, thereby establishing a limitation on expenditures for the operations of the District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF BOWLES METROPOLITAN DISTRICT, DENVER AND JEFFERSON COUNTIES, COLORADO:

1. The budget, as submitted, amended, and summarized by fund, is hereby approved and adopted as the budget of the District for the year stated above.
2. The budget is hereby approved and adopted, shall be certified by the Secretary of the District to all appropriate agencies and is made a part of the public records of the District.
3. The sums set forth as the total expenditures of each fund in the budget attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and incorporated herein by reference are hereby appropriated from the revenues of each fund, within each fund, for the purposes stated.

BUDGET MESSAGE**

Attached please find a copy of the adopted 2021 budget for the Bowles Metropolitan District.

The Bowles Metropolitan District has adopted three separate funds, a General Fund to provide for general operating, maintenance and landscape expenditures and transfers to the Debt Service and Capital Projects Funds; a Debt Service Fund to provide for the payment of principal and interest on the outstanding general obligation debt; and a Capital Projects Fund to provide for the estimated infrastructure costs that are to be built for the benefit of the District.

The District's accountants have utilized the modified accrual basis of accounting and the budget has been adopted after proper postings, publications and public hearing.

The primary sources of revenue for the District in 2021 will be property and specific ownership taxes from Jefferson County and the City and County of Denver and HOA contributions. In 2021, the District intends to impose a mill levy on all property within the District totaling 40.000 mills, of which 18.122 mills will be dedicated to the General Fund and the balance of 21.878 mills will be allocated to the Debt Service Fund.

RESOLUTION TO SET MILL LEVIES

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOWLES METROPOLITAN DISTRICT LEVYING
GENERAL PROPERTY TAXES, PURSUANT TO SECTION 39-1-111, C.R.S., FOR THE
YEAR 2020, TO HELP DEFRAY THE COSTS OF GOVERNMENT FOR THE 2021
BUDGET YEAR**

A. The Board of Directors of the Bowles Metropolitan District (the “**District**”) has adopted an annual budget in accordance with the Local Government Budget Law, on December 8, 2020.

B. The adopted budget is attached as Exhibit A to the Resolution of the Board of Directors of the District to Adopt Budget and Appropriate Sums of Money, and such budget is incorporated herein by this reference.

C. The amount of money necessary to balance the budget for general fund expenses from property tax revenue is identified in the budget.

D. The amount of money necessary to balance the budget for debt service fund expenses from property tax revenue is identified in the budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 39-1-111(5) and 39-5-128(1), C.R.S., BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Bowles Metropolitan District, Denver and Jefferson Counties, Colorado, that:

1. For the purpose of meeting all general operating expenses of the District during the 2021 budget year, the District determined to levy mills upon each dollar of the total valuation for assessment of all taxable property within the District, as set forth in the budget, to raise the required revenue.

2. That for the purpose of meeting all debt retirement expenses of the District during the 2021 budget year, the District determined to levy mills upon each dollar of the total valuation for assessment of all taxable property within the District, as set forth in the budget, to raise the required revenue.

3. That for the purpose of meeting all contractual obligation expenses of the District during the 2021 budget year, the District determined to levy mills upon each dollar of the total valuation for assessment of all taxable property within the District, as set forth in the budget, to raise the required revenue.

4. That the Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to immediately certify to the Board of County Commissioners of Denver and Jefferson Counties, Colorado, the mill levies for the District as set forth in the District’s Certification of Mill Levies, attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and incorporated herein by reference, recalculated as needed upon receipt of the final certification of valuation from the County Assessors in order to comply with any applicable revenue and other budgetary limits.

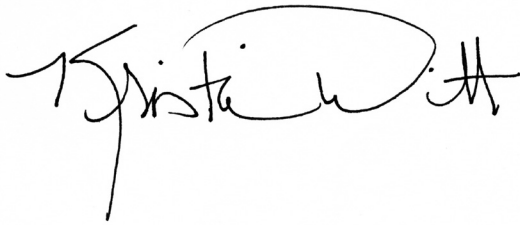
